

Readings/Resources


- This is where you can list readings for the week,

To **link directly to Sakai tools** including Forums, Assignments, and Tests & Quizzes, select the **plus button** on the bottom right and then select one of the following:

- · Link to an Assignment
- · Link to a Test or Quiz
- · Link to a Forum or Topic



Best practices for using Canvas:

- Clear presentation of course information
- Structured organization of course events/material

Benefits of this approach:

- Creates a more inclusive learning environment
- Less effort learning your course site = better able to focus on learning content

- Modify the homepage




At this point, evaluate which work more effectively: Migrated site vs. Blank site


