

Gradescope

Providing efficient, consistent and personalized feedback


- Integrated in Canvas roster sync & grade sync
- digitalize, recognize, and group written answers with AI assistance
- create and apply grading rubrics with prompts
- change the point value associated with a particular mistake once and apply to the entire population
- quickly reuse the same comment applying to the same situations
- make collaborative grading possible and consistent
- return feedback and grades digitally with a few clicks
- get a clear picture of how your students are doing and whether they read the feedback





Canvas Assignments

The Assignment Index Page displays

- Assignments (graded/not graded)
- Graded Quizzes/Surveys
- Graded Discussions



Assignments

- Any graded assessment will automatically create a column in Canvas Gradebook
- Gradebook Category in Sakai = Assignment Group in Canvas
- Categories and Weighting are set up in Assignments





General Suggestions

- Build and test out your assessments in your Canvas
 Sandbox site.
- Use the Student View feature to **take your assessments** and see exactly what your students will see.
- Set up low-stakes assessments first.
- Hide the "Files" folder.
- Pay attention to grade/feedback release settings.



Pause and Practice I

- Create an assignment
- Edit settings
 - Display Grades as any type except "Not Graded"
 - **Submission type**: online File Uploads
- Publish
- Go to student view and submit a document



Pause and Practice II

• Grade the submission using Speedgrader



Wrap-up

- "Assignments" page is the place to set up all assessments.
- "Grades" page is mostly for grade release and viewing.
- Manage grade visibility carefully.
- Use the student view to try out your assessment.

- Try the external tool Gradescope you may use for assessment


